Auditorium spaces are designed to accommodate large audiences. As such, they tend to have wide spans and are multiple-stories high in order to accommodate seating, sightlines, and acoustical requirements. Raised stage/dais floors and special lighting equipment are often required as well.

"The design of various types of auditoriums (theatres, lecture halls, churches, concert halls, opera houses, and cinemas) has become a complex problem in contemporary architectural practice because, in addition to aesthetic, functional, technical, artistic and economical requirements, an auditorium often has to accommodate an unprecedented large audience."

The amount of space required for each auditorium depends on a number of factors but the following guides, based on modern seating design can give you an idea of the area needed: 200 seats: 270m² | 2,900 ft2 150 seats: 190m² | 2,000 ft2 75 seats: 125 m² | 1,350 ft2

Floor design: Risers, 12" Example of wide fan . 3/4 arena: This form is typically used for open space theaters and is based on the continental seating arrangement. It closely resembles amphitheaters and is one of the oldest auditorium designs, dating back to the Greek era.

Theatre Design - Auditorium. Primary objective = bring in as many people as possible within the optimum range of distances from the performance area, by: increasing the degree of encirclement in plan. vertical layering eg. add in one or more tiers - this has the advantage of increasing number of seats without unduly increasing the distance from the stage.

Design 6: Theatre Design - Auditorium

Row lengths and seating: Average minimum space per person, 20 inches width; more realistic, 24 inches; 13 or 14 persons maximum on each row. Note: Most building codes are based on 18 inches per person. Aisle widths (check local codes): Center or main aisle, 4 feet minimum; 5 feet or more recommended.
