What is Direct Characterization? Direct Characterization tells the audience what the personality of the character is.. Example: "The patient boy and quiet girl were both well mannered and did not disobey their mother." Explanation: The author is directly telling the audience the personality of these two children. The boy is "patient" and the girl is "quiet."

Here, John Steinbeck in *The Grapes of Wrath* shows a character's personality indirectly. He doesn't say that hitchhiker Joad is a down-and-out, blue-collar worker. Instead, the indirect characterization uses the props a worker in the context would have - whiskey, cigarettes, calloused hands - to show Joad's character.

Direct Characterization Examples . Characterization refers to how authors develop the characters in their texts. Characterization can be direct or indirect.. Direct characterization is when the author comes right out and tells us about a character. The narrator tells us explicitly what the character is like, and we do not have to infer from the characters actions or appearance.

Direct characterization is things the author tells us directly about other people. This is tricky for *Catcher in the Rye*. There is no unbiased and omniscient narrator to give us something direct. Instead we have Holden, a very unreliable narrator. Much of what he says are reflections of his own insecurities.

An example of direct characterization in the book | The ...

Indirect characterization occurs when the author shows the character in action, and lets the reader interpret what these actions reveal about the character. For example, the author may write, "At report card time Sarah was the one who brought home all "A"s."
